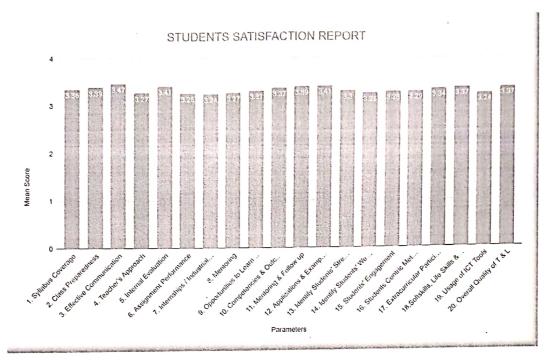
1.1 Descriptive Statistics – Mean Score Analysis

It is infered that Effective Communication has the highest mean score of 3.47 and usage of ICT tools and Industrial visits and internships are less with the least mean score of 3.24.

1.4 Action Taken

Internship / Fieldtrips were made mandatory for all students. Special sessions were conducted by the departments to emphasize the importance of internships. During pandemic, virtual industrial visits were organized. The college offered internship opprotunities to students through centre of excellence.

Virtual classes were conducted using ICT tools like Gmeet, Google classroom, e-content, Gamification tools etc. The College has initiated the development of customized Learning Management System (LMS) in ERP for content sharing, assignments and assessments.

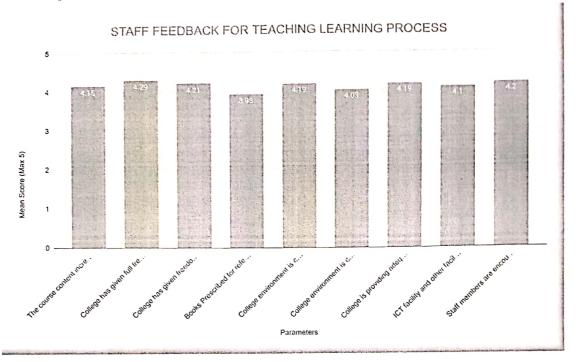
2.1 Descriptive Statistics – Mean Score Analysis

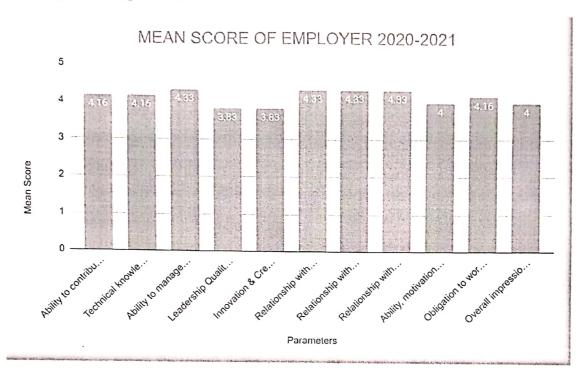

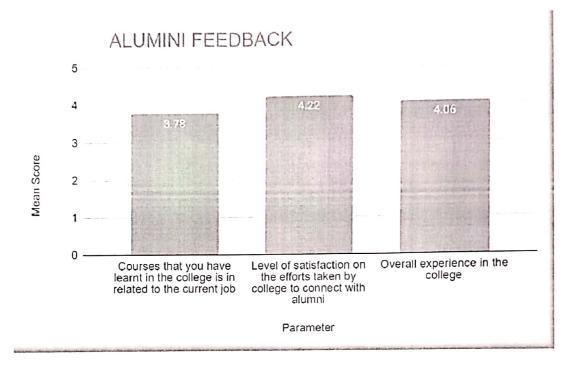
4.1 Descriptive Statistics – Mean Score Analysis
